True, Fake, or Conspiracy Theory How to Play

- 1. Contestants are split into teams
- 2. An article, video or photo is shown to the contestants.
- 3. Teams will decide whether the article is True, Fake or a Conspiracy Theory. Teams can also conclude "Need More Information/Can't Agree" if unsure. Individuals can also record their own answers.
 - **True** = factually correct and accurate
 - **Fake** = factually incorrect; author knows, or should have known, information not true
 - **Conspiracy theory** (CT) = intent unknown; difficult or impossible to definitively ascertain accuracy of claims
 - Need More Info = can't decide? No worries! Sometimes it's best to Google to make sure
- 4. During deliberations, teams can ask for the following clues from the game show host:
 - Author name
 - o Author biography
 - Publication title
 - Publication "About Us" page
 - Source(s) cited
 - Spelling and/or grammatical errors
- 5. Scoring:
 - a. Each correct answer is worth 1 point.
 - **b**. Each incorrect answer is worth -1 points.
 - c. "Need more information" is worth 0 points.
