

- **I. Call to Order:** Donna Corbeil chaired the meeting, with a call to order at 10:00 a.m.
- **II. Adoption of the Agenda:** The agenda was approved as distributed.
- **III. Minutes:** The minutes of the July 26, 2013 meeting were approved as distributed. (M/S Reinhart/Flynn)

IV. Old Business

A. BALIS Three-Year Fund Allocation and Project Plan: Linda Crowe and Terry Jackson presented two options (Attachment 2). Option One included three grant cycles of Innovation Grants for \$150,000 each year and Option Two included \$75,000 for ENKI and three rounds of Innovation Grants for \$125,000 each year. Both options recommended that the Council reserve \$150,000 for future expenses for the two BALIS retirees' medical coverage.

The Council agreed to authorize PLP to reserve these funds and make the payments. There was discussion as to the purpose of existing just to expend the fund balance. There were questions as to how best to sunset the organization if that was the direction the Council chose and staff said they would look into the logistics and report back. Sean Reinhart said that rather than funding the projects detailed in the two options, he would prefer to see the fund balance be divided up among the member libraries according to the formula. No action was taken on the presented options with any funding requests tabled until there is a broader discussion of the disposition of the reserve fund balance. Staff was directed to come back with the

numbers as to how the funds would be distributed with a goal of offering maximum flexibility in how the funds are made available to the library jurisdictions.

V. New Business

A. DPLA (Digital Public Library of America) and Digitization Initiatives in California: Luis Herrera was unable to attend the meeting due to illness, so Linda Crowe shared the information and the survey that Luis had given her with the Council. The Council was interested but wanted to better understand the local application and implications. They thought this would be an appropriate project for the PLP arena and hoped that Luis could work with the Executive Committee to provide background that could then be shared with all of the PLP libraries, perhaps using a "pay to play" business model.

VI. Reports

- A. BALIS Committees Update: Terry Jackson reported that the Adult Services and E-Services Committees have merged and that Cosette Ratliff of Alameda Free Library is the new chair. Their next meeting is November 7th. They have a draft 2012-13 Annual Report and a 2013-14 Work Plan. The Children's Services Committee continues to meet quarterly on the third Thursday of January, April, July and October. Terry also distributed the Annual Report for 2012-13 from the PLP Staff Development Committee.
- B. System Chair's Report: None.
- **C. Report of System Administration:** Linda gave an update on the State Library and CENIC survey and the importance of gathering this information to better assess the need for increased bandwidth statewide. This information will be used to develop a funding proposal for the State budget. Linda also reminded the Council that the PLP Legislative Breakfast is scheduled for Saturday, September 14th.
- VII. Public Comment: No public comment.
- VIII. Agenda Building for the next Meeting: A future meeting was not scheduled at this time.

SUBJECT: Allocation of BALIS Reserves

At the last BALIS Administrative Council meeting on September 13th, there was discussion on how to best allocate the BALIS reserves and the implications for BALIS as a system.

The Council agreed to reserve \$150,000 for future expenses for the two BALIS retirees' medical coverage, and authorize PLS to reserve these funds, monitor the accounts, and make the necessary payments. A motion to that effect is item IV. B. on the agenda. As discussed at the last meeting, because of this contractual obligation, BALIS needs to remain a system, if in name only.

Attached for your review are:

- the itemized fund balance statement with a remaining fund balance of approximately \$400,000.
- the fund balance dispersed according to the BALIS formula and the current amount that is being paid in PLP Member Participation fees (previously distributed in an email attachment after the last Council meeting)
- grant totals that each jurisdiction has received in the past five years (also distributed in the email attachment after the last Council meeting)
