- deeper dives on subjects like policing in library, creating care resources for BIPOC staff, and how to navigate a large bureaucratic library system that is thriving on the myth of meritocracy at the expense of many marginalized staff and patrons.
- Mental health and mental illness --equity issues, how do we actually make library work accessible to colleagues w/ mental illness?, how do we equitably and responsively serve patrons w/ mental illness?
- Digital divide, social justice at the library
- Youth services and programming and racial equity
- How the library can help overcome political polarization.
- Adding a session on self-care, stretching, yoga or mindfulness
- Since technology moves so swiftly, it would probably be good to have a privacy session
 once a year or every second year. In addition, since COVID_19 may still be with us next

Brown Act

The legislative body of a local agency may use teleconferencing in connection with any meeting or proceeding authorized by law. Cal. Gov't Code §54953(b)(1). A "teleconference" is "a meeting of a legislative body, the members of which are in different locations, connected by electronic means, through either audio or video, or both." Cal. Gov't Code § 54953(b)(4). A local agency may provide the public with additional teleconference locations. Cal. Gov't Code § 54953(b)(4).

The teleconferenced meeting must meet the following requirements:

- (1) it must comply with all of the Act's requirements applicable to other meetings;
- (2) all votes must be taken by roll call;
- (3) agendas must be posted at all teleconference locations and the meeting must be conducted in a manner that protects the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties or public appearing before the body;
- (4) each teleconference location must be identified in the notice and agenda and each location must be accessible to the public;
- (5) during the teleconferenced meeting, at least a quorum of the members of the legislative body must participate from locations within the boundaries of the body's jurisdiction; and
- (6) the agenda must provide the public with an opportunity to address the legislative body at each teleconference location. Cal. Gov't Code § 54953(b).
